Dear Parents,


I was disappointed to witness some quite alarming driving and parking on Thursday. Mr. Jorge usually stands at the bottom of Philip Road to ensure that our children remain safe. He does this by making sure parents do not drive up towards the school to drop off their children. On Thursday, Mr. Jorge wasn't there, so some parents took advantage of this. Unfortunately, some parents thought it was ok to park illegally on the zig-zag lines. It clearly states that parking is not allowed in these zig zags between 0800 and 1700 during school term time. It doesn't matter whether you stop for under a minute or over an hour. It is illegal. I will encourage our residents to report illegal parking to the police 101 number and take photos of cars if it is safe to do so. Some parents also decided to park across driveways. Again, I will encourage our local residents to report this inconsiderate parking to the police 101 number. As a school, we are taking reasonable action to ensure that traffic around our school site is safe. Philip Road is manned by Mr. Jorge before and after school each day. The local residents fully support and appreciate this, as do the vast majority of our parents.



There will be occasions when Mr. Jorge is not there and I do appeal to your better judgement and ask you to continue to park at the bottom of Philip Road and to adhere to the voluntary one way system. This is because there is very little room to turn around at the top of Philip Road, and as there are children arriving at school, 3 point turns are extremely dangerous. Parking on the pavements forces our pupils, your children, into the road and parking on zig zag lines is illegal. To ensure we are taking reasonable action, I will therefore also be instructing my staff to report any inconsiderate or illegal parking.

MESSAGES FROM THE TEACHERS & STUDENTS...

Reception

This week in Reception we have started to learn more about sea animals, through our new story Barry the Fish with Fingers. We have also had lots of fun in the sun! We have been using different shaped bubble wands to see who can make the biggest bubbles...we even made some of our bubbles bounce!!! Please remember if this hot weather continues, that the children need named sunhats, water bottles and please apply sun cream before they come to school. Have a great weekend!

Year 1

This week, in our English lessons, we have thought about adjectives to describe how a character is feeling and have also reviewed when capital letters are used. We have also looked at the structure of a persuasive letter, ready to write one next week. In maths we have looked at calendars, days of the week and the months of the year. It would be really helpful if you could question the children on these. For example, what day comes after/before Tuesday and which month comes after June etc? In science the children were fascinated with all the different ways seeds are dispersed. We have studied the life of Mary Anning, the famous fossil hunter, and the children should be able to tell you why she was significant in our history.

Year 2

I am very impressed with the hard work from Year 2 this week. They have been exploring high quality vocabulary and using it to build fantastic expanded noun phrases and sentences, uplevelling their writing by checking that they have used capital letters, full stops and their phonics to spell. In computing, we have begun coding and the children had lots of fun creating an airport, making the helicopters and planes move from the algorithms that they had made. It was lovely to see them problem solving together when their code didnt' work and helping each other to overcome difficulties.

Year 3

In Maths this week we have been learning about mass and capacity. So far we have compared the weights of different objects and recorded measurements in grams and kilograms. In Art we have been learning about Vincent Van Gogh, focusing on his drawings of trees and flowering plants. This week we sketched our class bean plant. In Science we have been learning about the functions of parts of flowering plants.

Year 4

It's been a great week with plenty of sunshine and new learning. Year 4 have started their new nonfiction unit in English learning about how to write a formal letter of complaint. I can't wait to read their final pieces. In Maths we have been learning all about line graphs. Year 4 have found plotting graphs a little tricky, but they are working very hard to get their heads around it! In science we have been investigating Isaac Newtons theory about light. We created our very own colour spectrum wheels to see how combining different colour particles creates white. We also stretched our learning further and investigated using a glass prism to refract light. By doing this, we were able to cteate our very own rainbow! Well done year 4 for all you hard work this week.

Year 6

Year 6 have done incredibly well this week. They are making great progress with their end of year production; learning their lines and the songs. They have also been reading a mixed perspective version of 'the highwayman' and have produced some excellent pictures to go with the story as well as vivid descriptions for the characters. In maths, year 6 have been learning how to convert data into percentages in order to draw pie charts. The children have also been looking and what it takes to live a healthy lifestyles in science. To consolidate their learning, they have created some wonderful healthy living posters which will be displayed in the dining hall.

An excellent week year 6, well done! Remember to learn your lines over the weekend so we can go off script in next week's rehearsals.
