#### RECEPTION

Welcome back! This week in Reception we have been learning about Halloween. We spoke about why people celebrate Halloween and what they might do. The children spoke about costumes they wore and the decorations they had in their houses. We have read the story 'Funny bones' and have enjoyed learning the songs about our bones. Please continue to read and sign your child's planner every day. We have sent home harder to read and spell words, and explained how to use them at parents' evening so please make sure your child is learning these words. Have a great weekend.

#### YEAR ONE

This week, we started the new half term all set to learn. In our History class, we had a blast learning about The Great Fire of London. We played detective, searching for clues from the past and present to understand the differences. We also talked about our similarities. Plus, we're making sure to work on improving our behavior and following instructions diligently. Our learning is both enjoyable and focused.

#### **YEAR TWO**

We are delighted to welcome the children back to school, and it's been a fantastic start to the term as we've hit the ground running with our learning. A big 'well done' to all the children who completed their half-term homework. We've received some incredible castle projects, and the excitement is building for our upcoming trip to Windsor Castle in a few weeks.

In our English lessons, we're diving into the enchanting world of a warning tale called 'Kassim and the Greedy Dragon.' The children have been actively analysing this story, which has been a captivating experience. During our Guided Reading sessions, we're exploring the book 'There is No Dragon in This Story,' and it's heartwarming to see the children so engaged and enthusiastic about it. In our Math classes, we're focusing on the basics of addition and subtraction. It would greatly benefit all children to practice their number bonds to 10 and 20. In History, our young historians are delving into the concept of a monarch and their primary roles. Thank you for your continued support. Have a lovely weekend.

#### **YEAR THREE**

The Year 3s have been amazing this week and have really settled in well after their half term break. I can;t quite believe it is November already!

In English we have introduced a new book called the Stone Age Boy. The children are really enjoying it. We have been using the book over in reading as well and the pupils are practising their comprehension skills by locating answers in the text. . In Maths we have carried on with addition and subtraction, they have had to make connections with the numbers as well as subtract 10s that go over into the 100s (place value). In Science we have introduced them to the new topic, Rocks, Soils and Fossils. In Topic we are learning about the Stone to Iron age and what it would be like to live in those times. The introduction was about why the ages got their name and to understand why history is important. - 'You have to understand the past to know about the present' Carl Sagan. In RE we are learning about Christmas and are considering whether it has lost its true meaning. We started off the lesson understanding what the holidays and/or Christmas means to us. In PSHE, we are celebrating differences. The students paired up to discuss the differences and similarities between their families. Then they had to draw their families and discuss what they meant to them. Friday is a special day, we have the Hobgoblin theatre company coming in to work with the class on prehistory times with the Year 3s which includes a production and workshop. 

Please be aware that unauthorised holiday absence of 5 days or more can now result in the issuing of a Penalty Notice which carries a fine of £60 or if not paid after 21 days then the fine is doubled to £120 and court prosecution if unpaid after 28 days.

#### Holidays

In total there are 175 non-school days a year. This gives families the opportunity to:

- · Spend time together
- · Go on family visits and days out
- · Go on holiday
- · Go shopping
- Attend routine appointments

If your child has a holiday of 1 week during term time and 10 days illness, they would miss 75 hours of education in the academic year. If this pattern were to be repeated throughout your child's school life, they would miss almost a year of their education.
