In Maths, we're learning about related number facts. Remember, practicing number bonds to 10 and 20 with your child helps with mental math and understanding maths strategies. #### **YEAR THREE**

The Year 3s have been amazing again this week. In English we have introduced a new book called the Stone Age Boy. We have been learning how to identify adverbs, verbs and conjunctions in writing. In Maths, we have been learning how to use the column method to add and subtract. In Science we went on a walk around the school to collect different types of rocks and were able to describe them and explain what buildings are made from them. We have been reading a book called 'Stig of the Dump' and In RE, we learned about Christmas symbols and what it means to Christians. The weeks are going by so quickly. Looking forward to week 3. In maths we have learnt how to multiply/divide by 10,100 and 1000 using place value grids. #### **YEAR SIX**


We've had a great week in year 6 this week! In maths, we've finished our multiplication and division topic and have moved on to fractions; looking at how to simplify them. In English, we have been putting ourselves in the shoes of our main character, Rose Blanche, and thinking about what we would have done in her situation. We also wrote a diary entry as Rose and looked at how to describe a setting using figurative language. I have been very impressed with quality of writing in year 6, and they have been able to show they can apply these skills in other subjects which is wonderful to see. In history, we learnt all about Evacuation during WW2 and year 6 wrote some excellent letters in role as a child

evacuee.

In science, we have started our new topic 'Electricity' where we learnt how to use scientific symbols to draw circuits. In PSHCE, we have also started looking at our new unit 'celebrating differences' and we began by looking at the word 'normal'. Year 6 had some excellent discussions and came to the conclusion that the definition is relative and that people's perceptions of what is not normal can sometimes lead to prejudices.

Another excellent week year 6 - well done!
