


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MESSAGE FROM MR HINGLEY

MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS

YEAR THREE

This has been a bit of a special week for Year 3. We went to the zoo which was great fun. They learned the diets of Animals just by looking at their teeth. In English, we have been learning to use expanded noun phrases to describe a setting. In science we learned about how important nutrition is and how to be healthy we need to have a healthy balance of what we eat. Please test your childrens knowledge of the main eatwell groups. in Maths we have moved onto a new topic, Addition and subtraction. They have learned to add and subtract 1s.

Homework - homework is every week.

They will be given it every Friday and expected to have it done by Wednesday.

This is to be done along with Matheletics and TimeTables rockstars. Their sign-ins have been stuck in their planners.

Reading and Planners - students should be bringing this in everyday and have it signed to show they are reading.





YEAR FOUR

This week in year 4 we have been learning about Martin Luther King Junior and Barrack Obama for black history week and we are writing biographies about them both.

In Maths we are working on addition and subtraction with 4 digit numbers.

A reminder that Year 4 pupils need to bring full swimming kit every Thursday for their session.

YEAR FIVE

This week, year 5 have been busy learning how to improve our sentences in English using relative clauses, formal conjunctions and expanded noun phrases. They will apply these skills when writing their biographies next week. I am looking forward to reading their final pieces. In Maths, we have been learning how to use inverse operations to check our answers as well as practicing 'multi-step' addition and subtraction problem solving questions. The class have found these tricky, however it has been lovely seeing their faces 'glow' when they finally work out the correct answer. This is what I love seeing! It is a reminder to them all that it is ok to get an answer wrong, but working out the answers step by step to reach an outcome whilst learning through their mistakes is actually the best way to learn. In Geography, we have looked at local maps of our area and have mapped a route to the Rye, ready for when we carry out our fieldwork. English - research and complete a fact file about a famous black person who has made a difference in the world. You will be using this to write your biographies next week.


YEAR SIX


This week, year 6 have been continuing their work on studying Windrush. They have been researching Windrush and the Windrush scandal of 2018 which they will be writing newspaper articles about next week for their hot write. Year 6 have taken a great interest in learning about this historical event and its impact on England today. Linked with this, they are also thoroughly enjoying our class story, 'Windrush Child' which is a novel about a young Jamaican boy who moved to England in the 1950s and details his experience with racism as he began his new life in Manchester.

In Maths, we have been working on multiplication and division, looking at the formal written methods for both. In Science, we have been investigating how shadows are affected by the distance of a light source.

To round of the week, year 6 visited Shakespeare's Globe Theatre today and they enjoyed seeing the historical theatre where Shakespeare's plays are still bought to life.
