Message from Mr Hingley

Attendance: As a school, we aim to have 96% attendance each week. This week, I am so pleased that Year I had more than 96% attendance and have won our trophy this week. Well done, that is a fabulous effort. Now that they have set the standard, let's all try and improve and try and get to over 96% as a school!

child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have-crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scables	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics


Attendance - information for parents

MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS

RECEPTION

Happy New Year! We hope you had a lovely break and it was so nice to hear all about the children's holidays when they returned and the lovely things they got up to. This week in reception we have been talking about our New Year's Resolutions and the things we want to try really hard at this year. We have also started reading our new story 'Whatever Next'. Please remember that we change library books on a TUESDAY. Lots of children were missing them this week so they've missed out on the opportunity to take a new book home. Have a lovely weekend.

YEAR1

This week In yr 1 the children have been learning about polar bears and how they survive in the arctic. They have also been looking at maps and how locate different places in the school using their mapping skills and key words they have learnt.

YEAR TWO

We have had a great first full week back in Year 2! In English we started reading and learning about the story 'Lila and the Secret of Rain'. The children made predictions about the story, then we read it together so they could see if their predictions were correct. The children also learnt about similes this week and how they can use them to describe a setting. In Maths we have continued our shape topic by learning about lines of symmetry, how to sort 2D shapes and counting faces and vertices on 3D shapes. In Science this week, we started our 'healthy me' topic. We discussed ways we can stay healthy and talked about the importance of mental health, as well as physical health. Finally, in Topic this week, the children learnt about the 'Big 5' Kenyan animals. They worked in groups to research an individual animal, and then presented it to the rest of the class. They all worked really hard and found out some interesting facts about these animals. A great start to the new term Year 2!

YEAR THREE

This term in English, we are writing adventure stories and our new text is 'Stone Age Boy.' This week we made predictions about the text and used time connectives to sequence the events of the story.

This term in Maths, we are learning to multiply and divide amounts. This week we have made equal groups and found number sentences to match arrays.

In Topic this term, we are learning about the Stone Age. The children in year 3 are working very hard at home to create Stone Age homes to show prehistoric life.

YEAR FOUR

How quick this week has flown by! Year 4 have come back from their winter holidays all refreshed and eager to learn. We have moved onto Multiplication and Division in Maths and have been learning how to multiply by 10 and 100. In Science we have started our topic of 'Living things and their habitats' and so far learnt all about the 7 life processes. Be sure to ask your child about what these are! In English, we have started our new text - a Lenape Tale called 'Rainbow Crow'. The class have been busy imitating this week, getting to know the main character and learning about its appearance and personality. Well done year 4 for some great work this week.

YEAR FIVE

Year 5 hope that everyone has had a lovely Christmas and New Year break. We are very pleased to be back at school and there have been plenty of new beginnings which have kept us very busy.

We welcome Mrs Guy, who is our lovely new teacher at the moment and has fitted into our class with ease. She is not a stranger to our school so feels right at home.

On Thursday, Year 5 had their first swimming session which everyone who took part enjoyed tremendously. But, we would like to remind you that your children need to wear swim caps and the instructor reminded Year 5 that they will need to have one for next week. Unfortunately, we don't sell them at school.

In English our class has been reading a book called Skellig, by David Almond. We would like to encourage your children to read more of his children's books. There may be a few in our school library. Some of his titles are: Heaven Eyes, My name is Mina, Kits Wilderness and A song for Ella Grey to name a few.

Planners:

Please could all parents listen to their child read at least twice a week for 10 minutes. Each book they read - free reader or school book should be recorded in their planner even if they haven't finished it. (The children do know this) There are still many parents not signing their child's planner on a weekly or daily basis. This is an essential link between home and school.

Finally, Mrs Guy and myself are looking forward to seeing your children learn and grow and so far, they have had a wonderful start to 2023.

YEAR SIX

Year 6 have had a busy first full week back, beginning our new topics for the spring term - all based on and around the work and life of Charles Darwin. In English we have been learning our text map for a report about the 'Galapagos Flying Lizard' and have created our own creatures to write descriptive paragraphs about. This is ready for next week when we will be researching some of the other animals found in the Galapagos and writing a report about them. In maths, we have been finishing off our work with measurement and length and year 6 have done really well on their end of unit assessments - well done! We have also started our new unit on Ratio and Proportion where we have been looking at additive and multiplicative relationships between numbers. In science, year 6 have started working on our new unit, 'Evolution and Inheritance' and have been looking at how plants and animals have adapted over time to suit their environments. In Topic, we have been learning about Darwin's 5 year voyage on the HMS Beagle and have started to plot his various stops on a world map. An excellent first week
