MESSAGE FROM MR HINGLEY

I am afraid that this part of this newsletter has been very sad to write. Some parents are letting us all down by parking inconsiderately. I have had 5 complaints from our neighbours over 2 days. 2 neighbours have been blocked in because people thought it was ok to park over driveways, we have had three cars parking on the pavement at the top of Philip Road and have had 6 parents park on zig zag lines. All of this is not only illegal but extremely dangerous. To this end I have contacted Buckinghamshire Councty Council and logged the parking as an urgent matter. I have taken photos and provided this evidence to them.

Mr Jorge has only been off for two days (recovering from an operation) and I am sure you will agree that the very few parents who put our children in danger have really let us all down. I have received complaints too from parents, and rightly so, about the dangerous nature of the parking. Isn't it a shame that the school provides Mr. Jorge for nearly an hour each day to monitor the road, which is time he could otherwise be improving the school grounds and on the days he is not here it is nothing short of chaos on Philip Road.

If there are any willing parents that wouldn't mind standing in for Mr. Jorge at the bottom of the road, please do contact me. YEAR SIX


