YEAR TWO

We started the week by reflecting on our memorable trip to Windsor Castle, providing the children with the opportunity to share their insights and impressions. In our English lessons, we are embarking on persuasive writing, equipping students with the skills to articulate compelling arguments effectively. In Maths, our focus has been on exploring subtraction with resources. In history, our students have been immersed in the study of William the Conqueror and the architectural legacy of the Normans, particularly their contributions to castle construction.

As a part of their English homework, children will be sent home a comprehension to complete. Make sure you are regularly logging into Mathletics to see their assignments.

YEAR 3

The Year 3s have been amazing again this week. In English we are finishing off our writing for Stone age boy. In Maths, we have been learning how to use the column method to add and subtract. In science we learned about what soils are made from and had a look at some soil we collected from the school. In reading we are reading about the Stig of the Dump and building our comprehension.

YEAR SIX


Year 6 have had a busy week this week, filled with assessments!
