-Wednesday 15 March 2023: all eligible members in England and Wales.


-Thursday 16 March 2023: all eligible members in England and Wales.

RECEPTION

This week in Reception we have been learning about Pancake Day! We talked about why some people have pancake day and what the meaning is behind it. We also talked about all the yummy things we were going to put on our pancakes. We have also started to learn about our new topic this half term " Do cows drink milk?", where we will be looking at the animals that live on the farm and we have also got some exciting classroom guests arriving this half term. Please continue to read with your child everyday. There were new observations of all your child's learning on Tapestry sent home before the holidays so please make sure you check it. YEAR ONE

Year 1 have had a lovely week this week and have settled back into class really well after the half term.

This week we have been reading the book "Farmer Duck" and from it we are learning how important it is to help each other. In Maths we've worked on doubling which has been fun, we learnt a new skill in PE which was how to bowl and in Science we have been talking about the season changing from Winter to Spring and what might change in the day.

YEAR TWO

The children in Year 2 have made a fantastic start to the half term. They have started a new text in English called 'Jim and the Beanstalk' and created their own story maps and sequenced the story using pictures. In Maths, the children continued with their topic, 'Multiplication and Division' by learning how to use the multiplication symbol and how to write their own multiplication number sentences. In Science we started a new topic all about plants. The children learnt about what plants need to grow then they did observational drawings of different seeds and bulbs. Finally in Topic, we have been looking at the artist Georgia O'Keefee and her detailed paintings of flowers. The children then completed their own sketches of flowers using Georgia O'Keeffe's style of close up observational drawings. We looked at different ways to use our pencils to create effects when we are drawing. Well done on a great week Year 2!

YEAR THREE

Year 3 have been working hard this week. In science we have been learning about rocks and did a really interesting experiment testing the hardness, durability, waterproof properties, and whether the rocks will be damaged by acid (we used vinegar). We have also been learning all about the Stone Age in history and the children have also enjoyed guided reading, spelling lessons and handwriting as well as getting to know Miss Stickland in their first week together. Well done year 3!

YEAR FOUR

Year 4 had a great start after a restful half term. We have started our new Topic on 'Burp, Bottoms and Bile' in which we will be covering lots of new knowledge around how the body works. The children have been exploring an interactive model of the digestive system in class and are enjoying pulling it apart and putting it back together. In Maths, we have continued our work on length and perimeter and have been learning all about rectilinear shapes and how to calculate the length of the missing side.

YEAR FIVE

It has been a very busy week of writing in Year 5 and your children have been hard at work publishing their balanced arguments. Their topic was about home schooling and they prepared their opinions, for and against leading up to their hot write. It has been interesting to read their points of view and how they have justified their reasons.

Our next topic is: Tudors and we have just started reading a book by Berlie Doherty called Treason. This will link seamlessly with our trip to The Tower of London next month. We are also looking forward to learning about the life of King Henry the VIII, his many wives and children and their life stories. Just a note - Many thanks to parents for signing and sending in your children's permission slips.

Swimming: PLEASE NOTE! Next week your children will be having a water safety session. They need to bring in their swimming costumes as usual and have a pair of pyjamas packed as a requirement for this lesson.

Homework: Spellings, Mathletics, Handwriting Practice and optional: Scratch

YEAR SIX

This week in year 6, we have been writing our own endings to 'Darwin's Dragons' focusing on speech and creating atmosphere. The stories have been a pleasure to read and I can't wait for the final published versions to go up on display! In maths, we have been continuing our work on Algebra, looking at how to form equations from a word problem and how to solve 1 and 2 step

equations. In history, we have introduced our topic 'The Victorians' where we have started by putting the Victorian time period into historical context through comparing it to the other historical time periods we have learnt about since

year 3.

In science, year 6 have started their new unit, 'living things and their habitats' where we have been looking at the different ways we can group animals depending on their various characteristics. In PSHCE, year 6 started their new topic 'Healthy Me' by taking on the role of an Agony Aunt where they responded to letters. They really enjoyed giving advice to children facing various scenarios regarding their health and well-being. Well done year 6 for all of your hard work this week!




Why is it Important to be Punctual?
