In Topic this week the children learnt about Hannah Ball (the school's name sake) and Dame Frances Dove. We talked about why these two ladies were significant and why they are important figures to Wycombe. All the children have come back to school with a really positive attitude towards their learning and I am looking forward to the rest of the term.

YEAR THREE

It is great to see year 3 back for the new term. For English, we are finishing off our character descriptions for Iron Man, students are using their adjectives and expanded noun clauses to help them create their writing work. In Maths, we have started to learn a new type of measurement, mass. The children are learning how scales work and the different types of measurement, kilograms and grams. We have an exciting new topic in science, we are learning all about plants. The students are looking forward to understanding what helps a plant grow and growing plants themselves. Monday.



Attendance, Punctuality & Meetings with Staff

As a school we are always striving to make positive improvements and hope that we can work in partnership with you as parents to make this happen. May we remind all of our parents that time off during the school term is only allowed in exceptional circumstances and all parents/guardians must complete a request form before taking any time off school.

Here are a few tips to help us keep moving forward:

- -Medical appointments, where possible, should be made at the end of the school day. We are aware that circumstances do not always allow for this, but there is an expectation that students should attend school before/after the appointment.
- -All Children should be in school ready to start learning by 8.55am (Registers are taken at this time). Any child arriving between 9.00am and 9.30am will receive a late mark. Children arriving after 9.30 will receive an unauthorised absence mark which will affect their attendance. Any child arriving after 9.00am must come into the school via the front door to be signed into school with a legitimate reason.
- -Do not keep your child off school for minor illnesses e.g. cough or cold. The school has qualified first aiders who can attend to most issues and if your child is deemed to be too poorly to remain in school you will be contacted to take your child home.
- Help your child to understand the benefits of regular school attendance.

Attendance Calls - Reminder

If your child is not able to attend school for a genuine reason you are required to phone the school and inform us as to why your child will be absent on that day and every subsequent day that they are absent. If the school is not contacted, Mrs Sullivan will contact you by phone to enquire about the reason for absence and to assist in encouraging regular, consistent student attendance. To help us with this it is therefore vital that all pupils' contact details are kept up to date.
