

#### **YEAR TWO**

We have had a great week in Year 2! In English the children have been writing their innovated stories based on the text we have been reading 'Jim and the Beanstalk'. They have written fantastic stories and L am really proud of their efforts. In Maths the children started a new topic on 'height and length'. They learnt how to measure objects in centimetres with a ruler and looked at what could be measured in metres. In Science we concluded our topic on 'plants' by looking at what plants need to stay healthy. The children looked at the bean seeds that they planted and decided on the ideal conditions to grow a plant. They were excited to see that some of their plants had grown! Finally, in topic, the children were exploring their local area. We looked on Google maps at High Wycombe and where the school is located. Then, in pairs, the children used the laptops to look for local landmarks and recorded the road names.

#### **YEAR THREE**

What a busy week in Year 3. We have been busy with our new english story "The Iron Man". We have creating a story sequence for one of the chapters together as well as created an awesome story map together of our wanted poster. In Maths, we are still learning our fractions and ordering them. In Science, we have finished our rocks, soils and fossils topic. We were learning about the different types of soils and what we use soil for. In PHSE, the students got to understand what Emergency Services are and their jobs are to know what their address is, postcode and phone number.
