MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS

RECEPTION

Reception have had an exciting week welcoming the arrival of real life caterpillars. The children have been using magnifying glasses to look closely at the caterpillars. They have already doubled in size after just a few days.

We will read the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar next week and we will talk about the life cycle of a caterpillar. Do ask your children to recap this wonderful story to you.

The children enjoyed a class party celebrating Eid on Friday.

Just a gentle reminder to send in a water bottle each day with your child. Can you please also be mindful of the school starting time. When children arrive late, our phonics lesson is interrupted and the children can lose valuable learning.

YEAR ONE

In Year 1 this week we continued with our phonics, guided reading, handwriting and in English we predicted the story of the Last Wolf. During story time we listened to the story of the Last Wolf and was surprised to learn how it unfolded.

We have an enriched programme on Wednesday of French, music and P.E where we continued to learn our sprint starts. We also have our Spellings quiz.

Just a gentle reminder that Homework must be done and handed in on Wednesday and next week in addition we have a Purple Mash task to do that is also due next Wednesday.

Reading books will be exchanged on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday please encourage reading at home. In Maths we completed an end of topic test on place value up to 50 before moving on to our next topic length and measures.

We have ended our week celebrating Eid as a class and have enjoyed our snacks and games together.

YEAR TWO

We have had a great week in Year 2. In English the children have been planning another letter to write to their friend.

They had to research their interest on the internet and then use this information to plan their letters. Towards the end of the week, the children began writing their letters.

There were some really interesting letters about Sonic,

Spider-Man and Disney Princesses! In Maths the children have been learning about Volume and Capacity. They learnt how to measure liquid in millilitres and litres. Year 2 had a great Science lesson this week looking at microhabitats. We went outside

and looked for different microhabitats around the school. They found some amazing microhabitats and saw lots of different mini beasts. Then the children had to sketch their favourite microhabitat and label the mini beasts they found. Well done on another great week, Year 2.

YEAR THREE

This week has been quite a busy week for Year 3s. In English we have finished Iron Man and have gone onto a new book called "Rhythm of the Rain". In Maths we have moved on from learning about Mass and are now learning all about Capacity and Volume, students are learning new maths languages like millilitres.

Students have been learning the parts of the flower and how each part of it helps the flower/plants grow. Swimming was a success, the students were so excited all day for it and they got put into their groupings. We are looking forward to what next week brings. Miss Stickland.

YEAR FOUR

This week year 4 have been busy imitating our English text 'How to Train Your Dragon'. They have looked at character and setting descriptions as well as learning lots of new vocabulary. Please ensure you practice learning your story maps as homework. In Maths we have come to the end of our unit on fractions and have learnt how to add and subtract fractions. We have also learnt what a proper/improper fraction is and mixed numbers. Be sure to keep practicing your weekly learning on Mathletics and your timetables. In Science, the class have enjoyed exploring simple circuits and have been curious about how the flow of electricity causes different electrical components to work. They have investigated and created their own circuits and have loved making different components work. Well done year 4 for a great week...enjoy the long weekend!

YEAR FIVE

This week Year 5 were treated to another Garsington Opera Workshop. They were very enthusiastic and enjoyed performing to Year 4 at the end of the day. The team were very impressed with their behaviour as well.

In English your children have been learning about the features of a poem and looking through exemplar poems to find these features. You might like to ask them what features they have learnt about.
